Upcoming Visit by Netherlands Ambassador Ard van der Vorst and Dutch Passport Renewals

GM's ongoing visits to Residents

As at the time of writing this report I have visited approx 75 Villas for a catch up. As noted in my October report I am grateful for the warm, friendly welcome I have received and am still following up on a number of Villa maintenance, gardening and other jobs with staff and outside contractors. I do appreciate resident's patience in understanding that our external contractors are sometimes booked on other jobs and are unable to do Village jobs immediately, therefore causing a delay in getting our Village work completed.

Getting Maintenance or Gardening jobs done

As mentioned in my September / October Reports if any Residents in Villas have any Maintenance needs (for example: leaks in your ceiling/roof, electrical matters, induction stove top, plumbing issues related to your bathroom / kitchen, painting issues for damaged doors, damaged wallpaper, faulty wall plugs or light fittings, spoiled carpets etc) you can go on line and log your job onto Skillet or call Reception on 09 838 6567 who can log your job for you. You can also log any Gardening jobs (for example replacement of dead plants, weeding, pruning of existing plants or trees, planting of new plants, general tidy up of your front / back gardens etc) onto Skillet or call Reception to log the job for you.

I genuinely want to ensure that Residents Villa Maintenance or Gardening jobs are to be done and actioned as quickly as possible, so please can I encourage Residents not to accumulate jobs. The sooner you let Reception know what jobs you need, the quicker these can be actioned for you.

Tuesday, 5 November

British observance commemorating the failure of the Gunpowder Plot of 1605. The Gunpowder Plot conspirators, led by Robert Catesby, were zealous Roman Catholics enraged at King James I for refusing to grant greater religious tolerance to Catholics. They planned to blow up the Houses of Parliament (Palace of Westminster) during the state opening of Parliament, intending to kill the king and members of Parliament in order to clear the way to reestablishing Catholic rule in England. The plan failed when the conspirators were betrayed. One of them, Guy Fawkes, was taken into custody the evening before the attack, in the cellar where the explosives to be used were stashed. The other conspirators were all either killed resisting capture or - like Fawkes - tried, convicted, and executed. In the aftermath, Parliament declared November 5 a national day of thanksgiving, and the first celebration of it took place in 1606.

Solar Import / Export Meters

— 23 Villas turned on

At the time of writing this report Trilect Solar Ltd has advised me that to the best of their knowledge all the Import / Export Meters for the seven panel solar power systems on Villa roofs have now been turned on, and all are operational. The residents who voluntarily chose to get the solar power system installed on their Villa roofs should see the benefit of lower electricity bills over the coming months.

Ongoing work on Villa gutters, iron roofs and tile roofs

Ongoing issues as mentioned in my October report are being worked on every month with Peter van Ham (Maintenance Coordinator) to assess and then obtain/ approved written quotes from Laser Plumbing Te Atatu Ltd (formerly known as Sumich Plumbing and Roofing Ltd) for the above required Villas.

Update on recently sold and upcoming Villas.

Currently BMC Contractors (Bryce and Missy) are in the process of refurbishing two Villas which I am pleased to report have now gone unconditional. The new Residents will move in on Friday 6th December 2024.

We also have a Villa that will be available for viewing in November, and another Villa that is in the process of being fully refurbished. We will notify people on the waiting list as soon as the Villa is ready to view.





Planting Be summer-ready

TOP TIP: Water your plants early in the morning or late in the evening to reduce evaporation and ensure more water reaches the roots.

Daylight saving often brings a surge in water demand as people spend more time outdoors and tend to their gardens. Now is a great time to be mindful of your water use at home. Before you head out to the garden, here are some water-saving tips to keep in mind:

1. Make the most of mulch

Apply a layer of mulch around your plants to retain moisture, suppress weeds, and reduce the need for frequent watering.

2. Group plants by water needs

Plant species with similar water requirements together to optimise watering and avoid overor under-watering.

1.Beat the heat

Water your plants **early in the morning or late in the evening** to reduce evaporation and ensure more water reaches the roots.

2. Right plant, right time

Choosing the right plants for your garden and planting them at the right time is essential for successful growing and saving water. Visit the **Auckland Botanic Gardens** website to view their database of plants that are suited to the region's conditions.



RECYCLING **TOP TIPS**

Keep it clean empty and rinse Remove **ALL** lids and put them in the rubbish bin DO NOT crush or flatten containers No containers larger than 4 Litres.

DO NOT place newspapers, cardboard etc in plastic bags, better to place in a cardboard box. **ONLY** cardboard packing boxes should be flattened. If in doubt, leave it out
