Guy Fawkes Night

Wednesday, 5 November British observance commemorating the failure of the Gunpowder Plot of 1605. The Gunpowder Plot conspirators, led by Robert Catesby, were zealous Roman Catholics enraged at King James I for refusing to grant greater religious tolerance to Catholics. They planned to blow up the Houses of Parliament (Palace of Westminster) during the state opening of Parliament, intending to kill the king and members of Parliament in order to clear the way to reestablishing Catholic rule in England. The plan failed when the conspirators were betrayed. One of them, Guy Fawkes, was taken into custody the evening before the attack, in the cellar where the explosives to be used were stashed. The other conspirators were all either killed resisting capture or — like Fawkes — tried, convicted, and executed. In the aftermath, Parliament declared November 5 a national day of thanksgiving, and the first celebration of it

Time to think about saving water before summer starts Here are some helpful tips to get you started



SHOWER

- Shorten your shower. Each minute you add to your shower times uses about 12 litres of water. For a household of three that extra minute costs you about \$90 a year in electricity.
- To help keep track of time, try using a shower timer.
- Don't just watch the shower warming up! Use
 a bucket in the shower to catch water as it
 warms up. It's easy to carry out of the house
 so you can keep thirsty plants happy in
 summer.

Water your plants in the morning

 the water can soak into the ground before the sun comes up.

DO NOT WATER PLANTS IN THE HEAT OF THE DAY

Water will just evaporate as fast as you are watering!





TOILETS

- Check your toilet doesn't leak. Toilet leaks are often silent. A continuously running toilet, can waste more than 700 litres a day and is not something you can ignore.
- Don't use your toilet as a rubbish bin. Only pee, poo and paper should be flushed, the rest should go in the bin.
- Use the correct dual flush option (half-flush for liquid waste and a full-flush for solid waste).



TAPS

- Turn off the tap when your are brushing your teeth – this can save 6 litres of water per minute.
- Rinse your razor in a plugged sink, not running water.
- Wait for a full load before running the washing machine or dishwasher.
 Dishwashers are a significant source of water usage.
- Turn taps off tightly, this can also help you check your taps are not leaking.

If you notice any problems, please contact Reception who can organise a plumber to investigate. If it is the weekend or a public holiday and is an emergency please contact your Village Trustees.

Planting Be summer-ready



Daylight saving often brings a surge in water demand as people spend more time outdoors and tend to their gardens. Now is a great time to be mindful of your water use at home. Before you head out to the garden, here are some water-saving tips to keep in mind:

1.Make the most of mulch Apply a layer of mulch around your plants to retain moisture, suppress weeds, and reduce the need for frequent watering.

2. Group plants by water needs Plant species with similar water requirements together to optimise watering and avoid overor under-watering.

1.Beat the heat

Water your plants early in the morning or late in the evening to reduce evaporation and ensure more water reaches the roots.

2. Right plant, right time

Choosing the right plants for your garden and planting them at the right time is essential for successful growing and saving water. Visit the Auckland Botanic Gardens website to view their database of plants that are suited to the region's conditions.
